As legend goes, it is said that the baby was born in a grizzly bear's den high in the mountains. One day while local skiers were ascending the peaks above the resort area, they found the Griz. While the skiers were watching him, the Griz stood shooting his enormous musket into the clouds and cause more snow to fall from the sky. This, of course, delighted the skiers who loved that special brand of powder snow. Thus, the legend of the Griz continues to this day
