Regular & Holiday Groups:

- To request a group booking, please complete & submit the Group Booking Form. Our Groups Coordinator will then contact you to confirm your booking.
- Groups of 15 people or more, with the same itinerary, qualify for group rates.
- One complimentary lift ticket will be provided for every 25 tickets purchased.
- *University rates apply only to students travelling with a university group.
- All group information must be submitted at least 10 days in advance of the visit date.
- Prices are in Canadian funds.
- **All groups must pay with one payment. Full payment is required the day of the groups visit. We are able to invoice for payment at a later date if a credit card imprint is taken as back up by the Group Sales Department. We accept the following forms of payment: MasterCard, AMEX, Visa, Debit Card, Company Cheques. Unused tickets must be returned to Group Sales by 2pm on the group's final ski day to qualify for a refund.**
- **Holiday Group Lift rates are in effect for Holiday Periods (December 21, 2024 – January 5, 2025 & February 13 – 23, 2025).**
- Lift prices are subject to 5% GST.

RELEASE OF LIABILITY/WAIVER

This Release of Liability applies once the lift ticket is purchased and can be found on the back of your lift ticket. It is posted in several places around the Ski Hill.

There is no waiver to sign; this release qualifies as the waiver.

The Ticket Holder agrees that the Ski Area Operator shall not be liable for any such personal injury, death or property loss and releases the Ski Area Operator and waives all claims with respect thereto. The Ticket Holder agrees that any litigation involving the Ski Area Operator shall be brought solely within the Province of Alberta or British Columbia and shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of the Province of Alberta or British Columbia. The Ticket Holder further agrees that these conditions and any rights, duties and obligations as between the Ski Area Operator and the Ticket Holder shall be governed by and interpreted solely in accordance with the laws of the Province of Alberta or British Columbia and no other jurisdiction.

THERE ARE ELEMENTS OF RISK THAT COMMON SENSE AND PERSONAL AWARENESS CAN HELP REDUCE. REGARDLESS OF HOW YOU DECIDE TO USE THE SLOPES, ALWAYS SHOW COURTESY TO OTHERS. PLEASE ADHERE TO THE CODE LISTED BELOW AND SHARE WITH OTHERS THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR A SAFE OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE.

- 1** *Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or avoid other people or objects.*
- 2** *People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.*
- 3** *Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.*
- 4** *Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.*
- 5** *If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.*
- 6** *Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.*
- 7** *Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.*
- 8** *Keep off closed trails and closed areas.*
- 9** *You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.*
- 10** *You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.*
